About 30 minutes north of Orlando lies the Disney master planned community of Celebration, Florida. Started in 1994, the town was inspired by Walt Disney's dream for a pedestrian-friendly utopia and it has added its own schools, hospitals, fire station, town center and many other businesses and faculties since the first residents moved in in 1996. Though the community is no longer in the Disney family – it was sold to a private real estate investment community in 2004, it's now home to 9,000 residents that occupy 4,060 homes and condos.

Garages are not visible from the street and are in the rear of the property and accessed by a service alley that runs behind the homes.
